SUMMER TIME PAINTING FUN

I've been thinking about giving the inside of my house a new coat of paint, and changing some of the colors of my rooms. Nothing can spruce up your home like a fresh coat of paint, and summer time seems to be the opportune time to do this chore with your windows open, whether you're a do-it-your-selfer or hire a professional. My one dilemma is that I still have quite a bit of partly used paint in my basement, so what to do with this?

Unwanted paint can be a problem. I know that basically leftover liquid paint doesn't belong in the trash. There are two types of paint: oil-based paint and latex (water-based) paint. Both oil and latex paints need to be disposed of properly. When discarded in the trash, the paint creates problems for waste collectors and for facilities that process our garbage. So here's what I found out:

Oil-Based Paint

Oil-based paint contains hazardous ingredients. Do not put it in the trash and do not mix it with latex paint. Look on the label for the words "oil" or "alkyd". Left-over oil and solvent-based paints, whether liquid or solid, should be taken to the Dane County Clean Sweep Facility at 7102 US Hwy 12, in Madison, for proper disposal.

Latex Paint

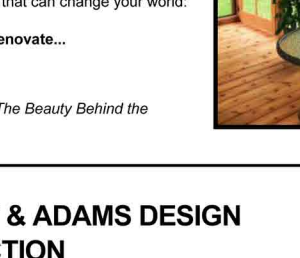
The best option is to use your leftover latex paint, or find someone who can. If you can't use it up and if it's over 1/2 full in good condition, Dane County's Clean Sweep will accept them for placement into their product exchange. Because latex paint is non-hazardous, it can be disposed of with your regular trash, provided that it is completely solidified or dried in the can. Never dispose of liquid paints in your trash. If you still have some liquid, but not much, you can mix it with clay kitty litter to absorb the remains and still dispose of in your trash. Or if there is less than a 1/4" of paint in the can, you can put it someplace safe, open the lid and let it dry up. Once the latex paint has hardened or solidified, it can be disposed of with your regular trash.

Storing Paint

Remember to store all paints properly. Do not let it freeze, place a piece of kitchen plastic wrap on the surface of the paint to keep it from drying out or forming a skin, and put the lid back on the can and tap firmly into place.

INSULATION, IT'S NOT JUST FOR WINTER

Do you remember last winter? I think of images of snuggling in front warm fires, thick sweaters, colder temperatures and snow outside. For many contractors, winter's when the phone starts ringing, when people feel frigid drafts in their homes and decide it's time to add more insulation.

But summer is when it makes more sense economically to air-seal and insulate your attic because cooling costs (running your electrically powered air-conditioner) hits harder than heating costs.

Having a buffer against the elements, hot or cold, is important. When it's cold out, insulation will keep the heat in and in the summer it'll keep the heat out. Attics, for example get very warm in the summer time. The summer sun can heat up roof decks to temperatures as high as 140 degrees (F). That temperature is enough to slow-cook meat, and it can drag on for hours a day, from June until well into fall. Without the buffer of insulation, that heat in the attic will leak into your living space and make you want to turn up your air conditioning.

In addition to comfort, there's a payoff with energy savings too. So, if your house heats up like an oven in the summer, NOW'S the time to add insulation. Don't wait for fall – insulate to beat the summer heat. Your house will feel better, and your cooling bills will be lower.

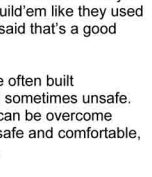

CARING FOR OLD HOMES

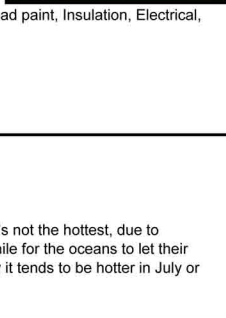
We love old homes!
